Spiritual Gifts

Session 1

"Overall Introduction"

Introduction: For the next two months, we are going to talk about Spiritual Gifts. We are going to define these gifts as well as discover the gift or gifts God has given each of us.

(Read: I Tim. 4:14-15) In this passage, Paul is instructing Timothy and tells him "not to <u>neglect</u> the spiritual gift(s) he had received.

All Christians have at least <u>one</u> if not more spiritual gifts. God wants us to discover those gifts and use those gifts.

(Read: Rom. 12:4-5) This verse says that the body of Christ, the <u>Church</u>, has many members and each member has different <u>functions</u>. Just as the human boyd has different members such as eyes, ears, nose, etc. which have different functions, so the body has different members who are gifted in <u>different</u> ways.

(Read: Eph. 4:7-8) In this passage, Paul says that we have been given gifts from the Lord. God has <u>spiritually</u> gifted each believer.

In the remainder of this study we are going to break down the gifts, tell what kinds of gifts they are and define the gifts. There are a total of <u>sixteen</u> gifts and they are broken down into <u>four</u> groupings. The groupings are support gifts, sharing gifts, speaking gifts and supplemental gifts.

SUPPORT GIFTS

- 1) The Gift of Service and Helps (Read: 1 Cor. 12:28b) The service and helps gift is the ability to recognize practical <u>needs</u> in the church and to joyfully give <u>assistance</u> to meet those needs. These people do not mind working behind the <u>scenes</u>.
- 2) The Gift of Giving (Read: Rom. 12:6-8) The gift of giving is to financially support the work of the church with joy and generosity.
- 3) The Gift of Administration (Read: 1 Cor. 12:28b) The gift of administration is leading the body by <u>steering</u> others to remain on task. It is the ability to <u>organize</u> and share God given <u>purposes</u> and long term <u>goals</u>.
- 4) The Gift of Leadership (Read: Rom. 12:8) The gift of leadership is to <u>direct</u> members to accomplish the <u>goals</u> and <u>objectives</u> of the church. You help <u>motivate</u> people to work together in <u>unity</u> to fulfill the church's mission and purpose.

SHARING GIFTS

1) The Gift of Hospitality (Read: I Pet. 4:9-10) The gift of hospitality is the ability to make visitors and guests feel welcome and at <u>ease</u> in the church. You also enjoy <u>entertaining</u> guests in your home.

- 2) The Gift of Mercy (Read: Rom. 12:8) The gift of mercy is characterized by cheerful acts of <u>compassion</u>. You have the ability to show empathy without <u>hurting</u> people. You help keep the church aware of <u>needs</u> in the church.
- 3) The Gift of Apostleship (Read: Eph. 4:11) The gift of apostleship is one who <u>motivates</u> the church to look beyond it's <u>walls</u> in order to carry out the Great Commission. They are people who have a passion for <u>planning</u> churches and serving in <u>missions</u>.
- 4) The Gift of Evangelism (Read: Eph. 4:11) The gift of evangelism is one who enjoys <u>leading</u> others to Christ effectively and with <u>enthusiasm</u>. They enjoy building up the church by <u>adding</u> new members to the church.

SPEAKING GIFTS

- 1) The Gift of Shepherding (Read: Eph. 4:12) The gift of shepherding is the ability to look out for the <u>spiritual</u> welfare and <u>development</u> of a group of believers. It is to <u>build</u> up or edify the church.
- 2) The Gift of Exhortation (Read: Rom. 12:8) The gift of exhortation is the ability to encourage members to be <u>involved</u> and enthusiastic about the work of the Lord. These people are usually good <u>counselors</u> and are good <u>motivators</u>.
- 3) The Gift of Teaching (Read: Eph. 4:11) The gift of teaching is the ability to <u>instruct</u> members in the <u>truths</u> and <u>doctrine</u> of God's word for the purposes of building up, unifying and maturing the body of Christ.
- 4) The Gift of Prophecy (Read: Eph. 4:11) The gift of prophecy is the ability to <u>proclaim</u> the word of God <u>boldly</u> to build up the body and to lead to the conviction of <u>sin.</u>

SUPPLEMENTAL GIFTS

- 1) The Gift of Wisdom (Read: I Cor. 12:6-8) The gift of wisdom is the ability to <u>discern</u> the work of the Holy Spirit and to help <u>apply</u> His teachings and actions to the <u>needs</u> of the church.
- 2) The Gift of Discernment (Read: I Cor. 12:10) The gift of discernment is the ability to aid the church by recognizing the true <u>intentions</u> of those within the body. They are able to test the <u>actions</u> of others in the church to help <u>protect</u> the church.
- 3) The Gift of Knowledge (Read: I Cor. 12:8) The gift of knowledge is the God given ability to learn, know and communicate the truths found in God's word.
- 4) The Gift of Faith (Read: I Cor. 12:9) The gift of faith is the ability to trust God beyond the human capabilities of the people. They have ability to help others trust God in the face of trials and difficulties.
