## **Question Series 6 - Questions on Marriage**

1) What does the Bible teach about marriage?

God intends for two people to marry who are <u>committed</u> to each other for a <u>lifetime</u>. No matter what burdens, trials and tests they face, the couple is to stay <u>faithful</u> to each other till <u>death</u> do they part. Moreover, God's word has <u>sanctified</u> the marriage relationship because:

- 1. Marriage was instituted by God. (Read: Genesis 2:21-24)
- 2. Marriage was and is to be monogamous, meaning God gave Adam only <u>one</u> wife.
- 3. The husband and the wife are to be unified <u>physically</u> and <u>spiritually</u>. (Read: Matthew 9:6)
- 4. The husband is to be the <u>head</u> of the wife (Read: Ephesians 5:23). Marriage is to be heterosexual. (A homosexual relationship does not fit God's <u>standards</u> in the light of biblical revelation). God <u>performed</u> the first marriage. He sanctified and <u>blessed</u> the first home and family. (Read: Genesis 2:22,24)
- 2) What does the Bible teach about Christians marrying non-Christians?

The first requirement for marriage for a Christian is that he or she <u>should</u> marry a <u>Christian</u>. (Read: 1 Cor. 7:39) In II Cor. Paul says, "Do not be <u>unequally</u> yoked together with <u>unbelievers</u>." It is dangerous for a Christian to marry someone who is not a believer because they have different <u>standards</u> they live by and will usually bring the Christian down to their standard of living.

Christians should not only seek to marry Christians but should seek the Lord's guidance as to whom to marry among those who are Christians.

3) What authority does the husband have in the home? (Read: Eph 5:22-26)

God's plan for the family is for the husband to be subject to <u>Christ</u>, the wife is to be <u>submissive</u> to the husband and the children are to be in <u>submission</u> to the <u>parents</u>. The husband is not to rule over his wife as a <u>dictator</u>, but he does have the responsibility to make <u>decisions</u> on matters affecting the family. However, he should make those decisions with his wife.

The husband is to love his wife as Christ loves the <u>church</u>. If this principle is violated, the wife will begin to lose <u>respect</u> for her husband and will often <u>rebel</u> against his <u>authority</u>. As a result, it will affect the children and they too will become <u>rebellious</u>. (Read: Colossians 3:18) The wife should submit to the husband's <u>authority</u> only as long as he does not violate God's <u>will</u>. When God's will is followed then the husband will be under the authority of the Lord.

4) Does the Bible teach that women is equal to man?

(Read: Galatians 3:28)

According to this verse the answer is: <u>yes</u>. Being in Christ removes all race, sex and national <u>distinctions</u>. We are all <u>equal</u> at the foot of the <u>cross</u>. But while the sexes are equal we have different <u>roles</u>.
